



## Pupil Premium Review Statement 2017

The aim of the Pupil Premium funding is to reduce the gap in attainment between Pupil Premium children and other children in each school. At Shepton Mallet Community Infants' School & Nursery we have approximately 25% of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium funding. On our website we have detailed plans which illustrate how that funding will be spent each year and the anticipated impact.

Each year the plans are reviewed and the impact of the funding is evaluated.

**The use of Pupil Premium funding at our school has resulted in the following outcomes;**

- **End of year data indicates that Year 2 Pupil Premium children outperformed other children in all subjects with differences of 11% in Reading, 6% in Writing and 5% in Maths.**
- In 2017 24.3% of pupils at the school were Pupil Premium funded compared to 25.2% nationally.
- In Year 2 there were 37% Pupil Premium, 37% SEND, 32% EAL and 34% summer born children.
- In Year 1 there were 22% Pupil Premium, 22% SEND, 52% EAL and 26% summer born children.
- In Year R there were 18% Pupil Premium, 22% SEND, 31% EAL and 49% summer born children.
- In 2016 the EYFS Baseline data shows 43% of Pupil Premium children scoring below age related expectations on entry. At the end of the year 50% reached a Good Level of Development compared with 55% Nationally in 2016\*
- 2017 Yr 1 Phonics data shows that 36% of Pupil Premium children attained the expected standard compared with 68% Nationally in 2017
- End of Year 2 data in 2017 indicates 83% of Pupil Premium children achieved the expected level when repeating the Phonics Screening Check compared with the 2016 National Pupil Premium figure of 84%
- **2016 National figures used until 2017 figures available.**
