

## Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium funding is sent to schools based on the numbers of pupils in the school who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM). In 2012-2013 it was expanded to include all children who have been eligible for FSM within the last 6 years. This money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

For 2016 - 2017 the school received £42,440 in Pupil Premium funding. This money is being used to help provide for the following initiatives:-
