



# **Pupil Premium Review Statement**

## **2016**

The aim of the Pupil Premium funding is to reduce the gap in attainment between Pupil Premium children and other children in each school. At Shepton Mallet Community Infants' School & Nursery we have approximately 25% of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium funding. On our website we have detailed plans which illustrate how that funding will be spent each year and the anticipated impact.

Each year the plans are reviewed and the impact of the funding is evaluated.

**The use of Pupil Premium funding at our school has resulted in the following outcomes;**

- In 2016 24.5% of pupils at the school were Pupil Premium funded compared to 25.2% nationally.
- In 2016 the EYFS Baseline data shows all Pupil Premium children scoring below age related expectations on entry. Although 25% fewer of our Pupil Premium children gained a Good Level of Development compared to the National figures, 30% had reached a Good Level of Development from a 0% starting point.
- 2016 Yr 1 Phonics data shows that 50% of Pupil Premium children attained the expected standard compared with 70% Nationally.
- End of Year 2 data in 2016 indicates 100% of Pupil Premium children achieved the expected level when repeating the Phonics Screening Check which was 14% above the National Pupil Premium figure of 86%
- End of Year 2 data indicates that Pupil Premium children did not perform as well as Pupil Premium children nationally, with differences of 7% in Reading, 13% in Writing and 5% in Maths for children expected or above.
