Ideas For Helping Your Child At Home

- Please continue to read with your child at home regularly. Five
 minutes a day of sharing a book and talking about it will make
 a massive difference to their view of themselves as readers.
 Individual reading books will be changed on a Monday,
 Wednesday and Friday when an adult from home has read the
 book with the child and written in their log book. Book bags
 are needed in school every day.
- Practising reading key words at home will also have a positive impact on your child's reading and writing development.
 Playing games, turning the words into flash cards, even saying them in the car or on the way to school will help.
- Talking to your child about their day at school is very useful and important. It helps the children remember important ideas, explain what they have learnt and helps to embed it further in their mind.

Curriculum Letter Autumn Term 2024 Year One

Dear Parent/Carer

In order to keep you up to date about your child's learning journey, detailed within this leaflet is a brief overview of our current learning focuses in Year One. We hope this information will help you to talk to your child about their learning experiences and reinforce this at home.

English

Our reading focus is on retelling a story using story words and talking about the characters. In writing we are learning to write a sentence about a picture or character. We will be practising when to use finger spaces and full stops and learning to use capital letters for a new sentence.

Our narrative focus for this term will be stories with predictable patterned language. We will be reading different stories and learning to retell them using story words. We will be learning about the characters & settings. We will be talking about what we are going to write with our groups and partners.

Our non-fiction focus will be reading and writing sets of instructions connected to our topic work.

We will also be reading and writing poems about festivals.

We will continue to develop our phonic knowledge and practise using known sounds to write regular words independently. We will be continuing to learn how to read and spell our key words. Correct letter formation and handwriting will also be practised throughout the term.

Maths

This term our main focus will be learning to read and write numbers to 20 in numerals and words. We will be counting forwards and backwards starting on different numbers and finding the number that is 1 more or less. We will use different equipment to represent numbers and help us understand the value of each digit. The children will continue to use their subitising skills to recognise a set of dots without having to count. We will be learning how to compare numbers using the words, more, less/fewer and equal. We will be continuing to develop our understanding of addition and subtraction comparing quantities and part -whole relationships. We will be beginning to learn our number bond facts for numbers within 10. We will be exploring 2D and 3D shapes and describing their properties.

Topic

Our topic for this half term is 'Farming'. Next half term's focus will be 'Festivals', finding out about celebrations in Autumn including Bonfire Night and Carnival. Throughout our Farm topic we will be using our investigative skills to find out about the animals that live on a farm and where our food comes from. We will find out about the crops grown on a farm and harvest time. We will learn how farming has changed through history. We will be using our science skills to find out about our amazing bodies including our 5 senses. We will learn about how to keep our bodies healthy and design our own healthy snacks. Our creative development will be based around sewing, printing and painting. Our physical development focus for this term is multi-skills and creating and performing dances. In Computing we are developing our computer skills, painting with the computer and learning how to use a computer safely and responsibly.
